After investigation, study, and staff input, the SHAS Board of Education has adopted the MN Academic Standards in these subject areas. We continue to maintain our diocesan standards for religion. To find our students baseline, grades 3-5 took the MCA's in language arts and mathematics. It was found that most students exceeded the standards for language arts, while many struggled to meet the standards in mathematics. To address this, we are focusing our attention on developing our math curriculum and instructional practices. As a Catholic school, we must aspire to academic excellence, if we are to survive in this fast paced changing society. We are on the right track!



We also purchased new science equipment for our intermediate grade students, which included: a weather station, temperature and oxygen sensors, and the computer software (in memory of Margaret Wilhemson).

From alumni donations we also improved our Accelerated Reader program, which now gives all teachers and students access to 150,000 on-line reading, vocabulary, and literacy quizzes on books they are reading at home and school. From the Pastor

Fifty Years ago this past October a watershed event in our faith took place in Rome with the opening of the Second Vatican Council. The results of this very important Council are still unfolding for us as the People of God today. Included among the many decisions that were made by the Council Fathers were two documents concerning the Liturgy and the Church in the Modern World. These two documents have had a tremendous impact on our lives. For these two documents highlighted the role of the laity in being fully and active participants in the liturgy, in the life of the Church and in society.

Sacred Heart Area School has over these past 50 years helped in forming the young people of our parish communities, as well as others, in understanding what this council means for the laity. 50 years ago the School was staffed mostly by nuns who were inspired by the documents of the Second Vatican Council and committed their lives to forming young people in the ways of faith. Today, although all of our teachers are laypersons, they follow in the footsteps of these nuns in passing on not only a great education in general, but one that is based in the principles and values that were taught by the Second Vatican Council. Another indication of the effects of the council is lived out today is realized in how the children are involved in various roles in the liturgy rather than just being present observing what is happening.

Alumni, formed in these Catholic principles, are actively involved in many areas of civic life on the local, state, national and international level. Some alumni are involved in a life of service to God and God's People such as Fr. Lauren Germann. Many others take an active role in the liturgical life of the Church by being lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, and many other forms of lay ministries. And all of this is a result of what happened 50 years ago as Blessed Pope John XXIII open this momentous council.

In order for Sacred Heart Area School to survive during these years since the Second Vatican Council, a time when many other Catholic Schools were closing for various reasons, Sacred Heart Parish made a commitment to keeping Sacred Heart Area School open. In doing so the parish made substantial commitments of her financial resources in some very difficult and trying financial times. The parish continues to make that type of financial commitment today as she also struggles to address the many other needs of her parishioners as well.

It is in this regards that I encourage you to not only be active and participating members of your local parish communities, but that I ask you to be active alumni of Sacred Heart Area School through the contributions of your time, talent and treasure. For Sacred Heart Area School to continue to form today's children in our Catholic principles it needs your help as alumni! I encourage you to do what you can to help us share the goals of the Second Vatican Council with our young people and to form them so that they might be the active laity who are willing to make Christ known in our world today.
