Preschool

The following includes just a few thoughts from the preschool room. It is amazing what you can learn from a child!

1. "Each child is unique". The same can be said for the class as a whole. Each class definitely has a personality all of it's own. Words I would use to describe the preschool class of 2020-2021 are: strong, brave, resilient, creative, artistic and they pay great attention to detail.
2. "It is okay to make a mistake, but it is NOT okay not to try". The growth you see in one preschool school year is incredible! They have come so far from where they started at the beginning of the school year. They can now do things they never thought possible. I am very proud of them and they should be very proud of themselves. They do still need reminders to give God thanks for the tools/talents they have been given to achieve success.
3. "Childhood/life is not a competition or race". The only one they need to compete with is themselves. They need to try to do better than they did yesterday and always try their best. They do struggle with the concept that everyone's best looks different. We try to individualize instruction as much as possible. It does help them realize that we each have our own strengths and weaknesses. They are very good at using their strengths to help each other.
4. Last but not least, "Do not do for others that which they can do for themselves". When you do it for them the only thing you are teaching them is that you can do it better than they can. My students know how to set a good example for each other. They have all learned how to coach, model and prompt a friends that needs help while not doing it for them. They help their friends help themselves because we are a try hard classroom.

FYI: We introduced bucket filling in January. I am using this in conjunction with red and green choices. It has worked well for us. The children earn green tickets when they do their very best, even when no one is watching or without being told to do so. A student came up with that criteria and it was so good I had to share it with the entire class.


