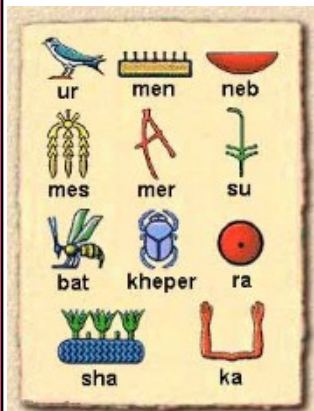


4th Grade News
