In 1924 construction of the existing school building started and was completed in 1925. We continually strive to accomplish this mission in a world that continues to change rapidly, as do its values. 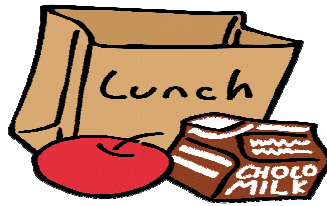

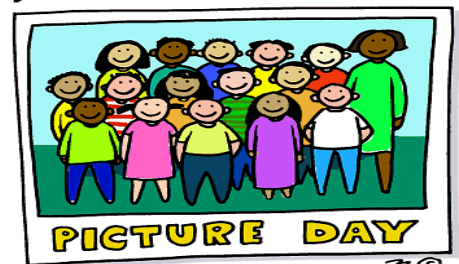
Before School Care
