As we begin this year, we should strive to make it the best year our school has had yet. To do this our school family must focus on loving and respecting God, each other, and all His creations. As teachers, we will work together to provide the most beneficial classroom management and discipline practices at every grade level, for happy, safe, highly productive learning environments.
