Preparing for Christmas at SHAS

The students and staff at SHAS continue to celebrate Advent this month in preparation for Christmas. All students meet each Monday morning in the gym for a weekly Advent reflection. Each week of Advent we add another lit candle to the Advent wreath, each with its own significance in our preparation for Christmas.

Program on Wednesday

This Wednesday the students of SHAS will have two performances of their annual Christmas program at 1:30pm "The Christmas Chronicles" (1st-5th grades), and 6:30pm "Let's Dress Up for Christmas" (preschool-Kindergarten) followed by the evening showing of "The Christmas Chronicles". This will be one of our main focuses for the next few days of school, with an hour of practice per program each day. Thank you students, parents and staff for all of your hard work!

More Christmas Fun

On Thursday, December 17th, SHAS will be treated with visits from Dianne Japke and our districts foreign exchange students, for lessons of Christmas celebrations around the world. On Friday, December 18th after mass, parishioners and parents are welcome to make apple pies in the church basement with Sacred Heart students.

OLPA Testing Postponed

Students in grades 3-5 were planning to take the OLPA tests this week, which are basically MCA tests that will measure where the students are today and need to go before MCA testing in April. The testing was delayed because of technical difficulties at the MDE level. We will, instead, take these tests the first weeks of January.

Marzano Practice Continues

Sacred Heart Area School teachers continue their work on the theories and practices of Dr. Robert J. Marzano's "Art and Science of Teaching". Classroom teachers are now posting daily learning targets in grades 1-5 in their classrooms, and discussing with students what their

objective for the day is. In the next week we will expand to posting scales for students to reflect what level of learning they are at. Teachers will refer to the scales throughout the day, continually making them self-aware of their learning, and encouraging higher level thinking. The Marzano training and implementation will provide a great deal of accountability for teachers and students to perform at higher levels and continually grow as individuals and as a school.
