We are hoping to have a significant attendance of school families at our



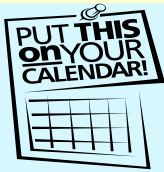
The Christmas program is right around the corner. If your child is in 1st-3rd grades they are asked to wear their Christmas finery. The rest of the children's outfits will be provided.
