Last year's board made important decisions such as adopting the Minnesota State Academic Standards and the tough decision to only keep sixth grade until May 31st of 2014, when SHAS will become a preschool - 5th grade school. This year the board has been working hard to improve staff pay and benefits, which included an extensive study and creation of next year's budget and most recently building updates. Individual board members also act as liaisons

to various school committees: including budget & finance, curriculum, fundraising, PR & marketing, and personnel & human resources. If you see a need or have a vision for the future of SHAS, bring it to the principal or one of these board members. We will listen.

We want to thank all parents for all the work you have done for the school this year. Our new minimum volunteer hours policy for K-6 parents has brought new faces to "the table" and new life to our school. Many of you have already completed your 8 hours and want more.
