End of the Day Dismissal

For your children's safety, the remote access security doors are closed from 8:10am until 3:00pm during the school day. The opening of these doors at 3pm does not mark the end of the school day, but rather a convenience for parents entering the building to pick up their children. The school bell marks the end of the school day at 3:05pm. When picking up your child(ren), please do not call your children out of the classroom prior to this time, unless you talk to his or her teacher beforehand. Doing so can be very disruptive to the class and make it difficult for the teachers to keep track of where students are. Teachers are asked, not to dismiss any students from their class until this time for the sake of keeping them supervised. We also ask that when stopping at the school during school hours to drop things off or leave messages for your child(ren) please check in at the office and check in with Sandy rather than interrupting your child's class.

Students in 1st–5th grades will work in local city parks, picking up sticks and raking leaves. Preschoolers and kindergarteners will remain on our playgrounds and city block cleaning up the area.
