## Principal's News from Jim Opelia, Principal




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There is lots of testing going on at school next week. Please make sure your child is well rested and has a good breakfast. Attendance is always important, but extra important next week! Thank you!


#### **Liquor Wagon - 2nd, 3rd, and 5th grades**

It is hard to believe we only have seven weeks left of this school year. Each year seems to go by even faster than the one before it and this year is no different. The Third Graders have been working so hard on mastering their multiplication and division facts along with exploring the world of fractions which they have found to be very fun! Our next adventure in math will be parallel, perpendicular, and intersecting lines as well as angles - things sure to be on our MCA and NWEA tests! In science, we have been working on sound energy - doing many experiments to show pitch, volume and how sound is made. The students made paper cup phones to show how sound travels and pan flutes from straws to show how pitch can be affected. Their last challenge will be to see if they can make up a song with it. We are just about ready to begin light energy. During Lent, the Third Graders did service by completely setting up all of the tables for the fish fry dinners down in the church basement. I am always amazed at how excited the students are to be doing this. They say it is just to get out of work but I know that they actually like having that weekly responsibility - each taking on a certain task to get the job done. Today being Holy Thursday, we did many activities that brought our focus unto the real meaning of Easter. We watch the "Rugrat Passover" movie, took part in the Fifth Grade Seder Meal, made Easter Wreaths, and did the "Resurrection Eggs" which allows students to see, touch, and hear the story of Easter. It includes 12 Bible verse readings, parts of the story, and opening eggs to reveal symbols of Jesus' journey to the cross. Each student completed a booklet of their own to share with their families.
