Inspiration and Illumination

Monday, September 30th, was Diocesan Ministry Day. School and Parish staff attended this conference at the River's Edge Convention Center in Saint Cloud, with a celebration of the Mass, learning sessions, and keynote speaker Fr. Fred Kammer. It is always an inspiration to be present with hundreds of souls who share the same goals and mission in ministry. One of the highlights of the day was a two hour session with guest speaker, Dr. David Walsh, one of the world's leading authorities on family life, and the impact of technology on children's health and development. A big part of his lecture was on the difficult job parents face today, in a world of "More, Fast, Easy, and Fun". He shared a great deal of knowledge on the development of the human brain and the effects that the stresses of the modern world put on the young mind. He also spoke of parenting and the family life of yesteryear, and how much easier of a job it was to parent in a world that supported family values. And lastly, he discussed the importance for a child to hear "No" in developing self-control and character. All of this stirred my soul as to the importance of our Catholic School and the huge job we share together as teachers and parents instilling faith, morals, discipline and knowledge in our children. I encourage parents and staff to further investigate the books and videos by Dr. David Walsh regarding the development of our children.

This annual tradition is meant to make children more aware of the dangers of fire and how to stay safe at home and school. 13 Days to Marathon

October 16th is our 2013 SHAS Marathon for Non-public Education. This fundraiser is very important to our school. Funds are anticipated as part of this year's budget in the continued operation of our school. Our budgeted goal this year is to raise \$10,000 for the school, or \$150 per student. As incentives for the children's efforts, if we raise the \$10,000, the students in preschool and kindergarten will be bused to the Leroy and Julie Peterson farm for pony rides, while the 1st through 6th grade students will enjoy a swim party at the Staples Community Center. These prizes have been donated to the school by the Petersons and the community center. The top fundraising student in each class will also receive a ride on a fire truck to the Staples Dairy Queen and a \$5 gift certificate to have lunch there. Each student who reaches the \$150/person goal will receive a SPECIAL prize. K-6 families are responsible to help raise funds with this event. We also welcome, encourage, and count on preschool family participation as well. Remember that this is your school, not owned, operated, and funded by the government. 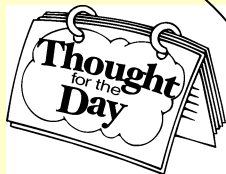
